Dear Mr. Fulkerson and Ms. Brookins:

Under the authority delegated to me by Governor Tony Evers, I am hereby approving the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission amendment to the 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Appleton (Fox Cities) Transportation Management Area. The amendment was approved and adopted by the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission on May 18, 2022. We will reflect by reference the 2022-2025 federal aid projects covered by this approval in our 2022-2025 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

Copies of the TIP Amendment and Resolution Number 24-22 for the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission are enclosed. This TIP amendment represents a comprehensive, continuous, and cooperative effort between the MPO, local communities, affected transit operators, and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), and is designed to meet the objectives of Title 23 USC 134 and 135 and their implementing regulations 23 CFR 450 and the MPO regional transportation system plan.

We have determined that the proposed amendment: 1) is consistent with the adopted Long Range Transportation Plan for the MPO, 2) conforms to this state's approved implementation plan under the federal Clean Air Act and 42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d) and 40 CFR 93 (23 CFR 450.222(a)(7), and 3) ensures that the TIP remains fiscally constrained in that federal funding resources are sufficient to support the new or modified projects.

**WHEREAS,** the MPO staff will prepare the appropriate documentation to meet federal and state requirements for any transportation project appearing in the TIP,
