2022 NR 135 Mine Reclamation Work Program

Enclosed in the meeting materials is the 2022 NR 135 Mine Reclamation Work Program for the Commission. The Mining Reclamation portion of the work program is identified by the number 1600.

In 2022, staff will continue to track quarterly budget items, review new mine site applications/plan modifications, conduct site inspections, certify reclaimed acreage, and update financial assurance documents. Annual operator reporting activities and collection of associated fees will be conducted. Annual WDNR reporting will be submitted along with the WDNR portion of fees collected. GIS data creation and mapping will continue as part of program administration along with the newly launched drone program. Operator assistance with permitting issues is on-going. Calumet County would like to rejoin the consortium; therefore, an updated County(s) contract will be developed in January with an anticipated program transfer in April 2022.

RE: Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan Updates

During 2021, staff worked on two Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plans updates: the City of Neenah and the Village of Fox Crossing. The Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plans (CORP's) are updated every five years to be eligible for Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) grants and funding with other possible agencies. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Stewardship program typically supports recreational infrastructure with a \$50 million annual budget. Grant funding usually consists of 50% Stewardship monies and 50% local match.

City of Neenah Progress:

- Recommendations and Action Plan metrics have been finalized for the 5-year period of 2022-2026 based on the Capital Improvement Program (CIP).
- Plan approval by the Park and Recreation Commission was made on December 16, 2021 and final adoption by City Council is slated for January 5, 2022.

Village of Fox Crossing Progress:

- The CORP is now completed.
- Plan approval by the Park Commission was on November 10, 2021.
- Adoption by Village Board, December 13, 2021.

RE: NR-135 Regional Non-Metallic Mining Reclamation Program Update

The following noteworthy activities were conducted in the 4th quarter for the NR-135 Non-Metallic Mining Reclamation Program:

- In November, staff met with the county planning directors and with county Planning & Zoning Committees to give a program/budget update. The 2022 NR-135 program budget was approved with an increase to the active acreage fee from \$33 per acre to \$35 per acre. The increase will allow the Commission to continue to spend down our carryover balance while getting closer to the true cost of the program per acre of approximately \$44;
- Two (2) new mine site applications and associated reclamation plans were received from Winnebago County;
- The Operator Annual Reports were sent out to the operators on December 8, 2021;
- Calumet County contacted staff to see if we would entertain administering their reclamation program. East Central formerly administered the Calumet County reclamation program from 2001 through 2013. Staff met with Calumet County staff in November to discuss a prospective transfer of the program back to the Commission. The matter was then brought to Land and Water Conservation Calumet County Committee and the Calumet County Board. It was agreed to move forward with the program transfer with a set date of April 1, 2022. The following activities will need to be conducted to insure a smooth transition, subject to final contract provisions:
 - Update and renew the contract with all five (5) counties in January;
 - Meet with Calumet County's reclamation specialist prior to transfer date to discuss individual sites and set a file transfer date;
 - Calumet County GIS Department and Mike Zuege will perform the transfer of GIS files;
 - Calumet County will inform operators of transfer prior to transfer date;
 - Calumet County will retain control of enforcement actions;
 - Staff will work with operators to change the financial assurance obligee after transfer;
 - East Central's per acre fee will not change for 2022, but staff hours will be increased to administer the program.
