Dear Mr. Fulkerson and Ms. Brookins:

Under the authority delegated to me by Governor Tony Evers, I am hereby approving the Fond du Lac MPO's amendment to the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Fond du Lac urbanized area. The amendment was approved and adopted by the Fond du Lac MPO Policy Board on April 4, 2024. We will reflect by reference the 2024-2027 federal aid projects covered by this approval in our 2024-2027 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

Copies of the TIP Amendment and Resolution Number 06-24 from the Fond du Lac MPO Policy Board are enclosed. This TIP amendment represents a comprehensive, continuous, and cooperative effort between the MPO, local communities, affected transit operators, and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), and is designed to meet the objectives of Title 23 USC 134 and 135 and their implementing regulations 23 CFR 450 and the MPO regional transportation system plan.

We have determined that the proposed amendment: 1) is consistent with the adopted Long Range Transportation Plan for the MPO, 2) conforms to this state's approved implementation plan under the federal Clean Air Act and 42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d) and 40 CFR 93 (23 CFR 450.222(a)(7), and 3) ensures that the TIP remains fiscally constrained in that federal funding resources are sufficient to support the new or modified projects.

RESOLUTION 06-24

AMENDING THE 2024-2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE FOND DU LAC URBANIZED AREA

WHEREAS, the City of Fond du Lac area has been designated by the Governor as a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), and;

WHEREAS, the Fond du Lac MPO Policy Board, with representation from all jurisdictions within the Urbanized Area, has the responsibility to direct, coordinate, and administer the transportation planning process in the urbanized area, and:

WHEREAS, all transportation projects in the Fond du lac urbanized area which are to be implemented with federal funds must be included in the annual elements of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and approved by the MPO as a prerequisite for funding approval, and;

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program was prepared to meet the requirements of Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST), and the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) as prescribed by federal regulations, and;

WHEREAS, all projects that use federal funds must appear in an adopted Transportation Improvement Program, and;

WHEREAS, to accommodate the need for additional funding and an expansion in project scope, the Fond du Lac MPO has approved additional Surface Transportation Block Grant – Urban funds in the amount of \$1,784,153 to the existing Pioneer Road Project (TIP number 443-22-023), to be added to existing federal funds of \$3,060,444 which brings the total project amount to \$4,844,597 and;

WHEREAS, the MPO staff will prepare the appropriate documentation to meet federal and state requirements for any transportation projects appearing in the TIP, and;

WHEREAS, all required public participation procedures have been followed;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FOND DU LAC MPO

Section 1: That the Policy Board, as the designated MPO, amend the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program for the Fond du Lac Urbanized Area to include the proposed projects.
